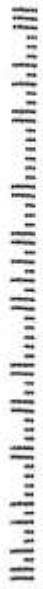

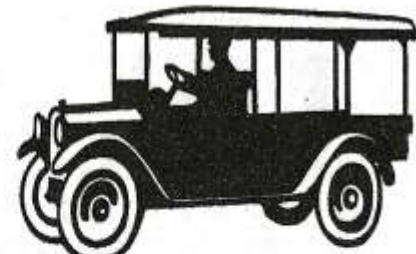
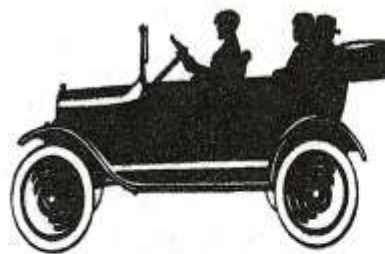
## LADIES' TEA

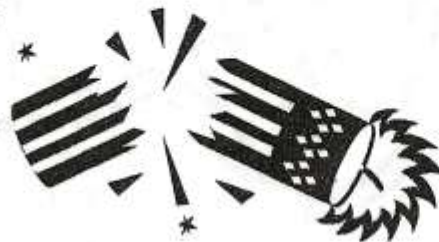
## AUGUST EVENT

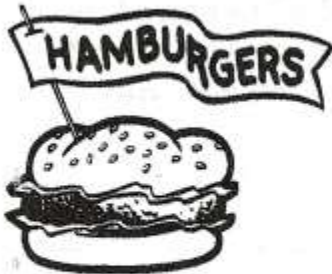
